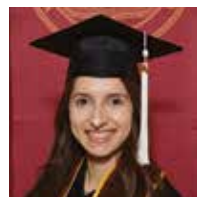

NANCY LORRAINE JENSEN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

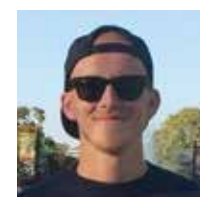
